

## LAT Decision Summary

### Summary:

The Applicant was first registered as a motor vehicle salesperson under the Act on January 22, 1983. A renewal of his registration, which was received by OMVIC on September 17, 1998, indicated the applicant had never been found guilty or convicted of an offence nor were there any charges pending. A background check revealed that, as at September 17, 1998, the Applicant had the following convictions registered against him: threatening, failed to appear, drive while ability impaired, refuse to provide breath sample, threatening, failed to comply with recognizance, watch and beset and battery.

Registration was renewed for a period of two years from September 18, 1998 subject to terms and conditions, namely that the applicant notify the Registrar immediately if criminally charged in the future. The applicant did not comply with these terms and failed to disclose an assault conviction registered against him on June 29, 2000. He also failed to disclose that on November 2, 2000 he was convicted of failing to comply with conditions of undertaking given and fined \$500.00 in addition to two years probation.

Registration lapsed on September 17, 2000 and the Registrar received an application for renewal of the Applicant's registration on November 6, 2000. On this application the Applicant did disclose previous convictions, but provided no details. Registration was revoked although the Applicant continued to operate as a salesperson.

The Applicant applied for registration once again on March 14, 2002, but failed to disclose a 1996 Florida conviction for battery. The Registrar refused registration based on the applicant's criminal convictions, his failure to make disclosure and his acting as an unregistered salesperson. The Tribunal supports this decision.

Registration refused.
